Mt.7.21-23 "Vanity & Deceit" Matthew Series: 'THE KING IS COMING' #103 November 22, 2020

Jesus said that few enter the narrow gate of salvation because:

1st - it must be <u>**found**</u> (v.14).

2nd - it is narrow & demanding is the **opposite** of the way of the world.

3rd - it requires going through alone & without baggage.

4th - it requires **penitence** & **brokenness** of heart (Lk.13.24).

5th - **false** prophets deceive people by luring them into the way that leads to destruction (vv.15–20).

6th - Jesus gives a final reason why so few enter the narrow gate of salvation: <u>self-deception</u>.

The two categories of self-deception are those:

- of mere verbal profession &
- of mere intellectual knowledge.

The 1st described in vv.21–23, involves those who **say** but do not do;

The 2nd described in verses 24–27, involves those who <u>hear</u> but do not do.

What lulls people into such deception?

First, many professing as well as true Christians—hold a false doctrine of <u>assurance</u>. God's own Holy Spirit will witness His <u>reality</u> to those who truly belong to Him (Ro.8.14–16). Calling & choosing are made secure by increasing qualities of <u>fruitfulness.</u>

Second, contributor to self-deception is failure of <u>self-examination</u>.

- A person who is not concerned about having his present sins **cleansed**
 - > has good reason to doubt that his past sin has been forgiven.
- A person who has no desire to come to the Lord for continued cleansing ...

has <u>reason</u> to doubt that he ever came to the Lord to receive salvation.

When a person habitually practices any sin without remorse or **repentance**,...

Third cause of self-deception is inordinate concentration on religious activity.

Fourth cause of self-deception is what may be called the fair exchange approach.

- apart from God it is **impossible** to do anything that is truly good, (Ro.3.12; Ps.14.1-3; 53.1-3).
- it is the <u>sin</u> itself—that separates us from God & brings death & damnation (Ro.5:12; 6:23).

Good does not cancel the **<u>consequences</u>** of sin.

(1) One is the superficial person.

(2) The other person is **knowledgeable** about the Bible & the Gospel & is involved in Church.

There are many ways people are deceived.

- **4** Those in the first group make mere **verbal profession** of faith & works.
- **4** Those in the second have mere **intellectual knowledge** of the Gospel they hear.
 - ✓ Those in the first group <u>say</u> but do not do;
 - ✓ those in the second <u>hear</u> but do not do.

The most important objective is not to identify all the many deceitful ways but to: find & follow the one true way.
