Soldiers were not only oppressors but <b>T</b> in the eyes of the populace.
He was possibly even a <b>S</b> , a half-breed Jew who was hated even more than Gentiles.
This <b>centurion</b> was undoubtedly a <b>G</b> -fearing Gentile.
Jesus <b>K</b> the man's heart and did not <b>N</b> to hear a direct request.
<ul> <li>The centurion</li> <li>affirmed the divine L of Christ,</li> <li>believing that Jesus was indeed G &amp;</li> <li>consequently, had the P to heal his paralyzed servant.</li> </ul>
But the benefit of the Gospel, which is salvation, is appropriated by F The Jews played an I part in God's bringing the Messiah & His Gospel. They are also destined to play an important role in the E times. To the Jews God had given the unique P & P of His kingdom
Jewish tradition taught that sinners/G would spend eternity in the outer darkness of Gehenna.
Part of the supernatural quality of hell is that it will continue for A eternity in total D
<ul> <li>Because they are false sons of the kingdom, they</li> <li>&gt; annul the divine P,</li> <li>&gt; forfeit the divine B, &amp;</li> <li>&gt; are forever barred from the divine K</li> </ul>
Jesus did not give the principle as a universal <b>P</b> to all believers. It is <b>S</b> applied as the Lord saw fit (9.29).
III. THE R WOMAN vv.14-15
Physical health, race, social status, or gender made no <b>D</b> to Him.
Being H & A of their need may have advantaged the disadvantaged.
That the kingdom was open to faithful Gentiles certainly did not mean it was closed to faithful Jews.
FAITH vv.5-13 1. Our sense of unworthiness should not <i>prevent</i> us from seeking God's help
