## Mt.9.9-17 "New Things" Matthew Series: 'THE KING IS COMING' #121 April 4, 2021

The kingdom of God is for:

- the spiritually sick who want to be **healed**,
- the spiritually corrupt who want to be <u>cleansed</u>,
- the spiritually poor who want to be **rich**,
- the spiritually hungry who want to be **fed**,
- the spiritually dead who want to be made alive.
- ↓ It is for ungodly outcasts who long to become God's own beloved children.

## THE OTHER QUESTION vv.14–17

Unlike the Pharisees - the question of John's disciples was **sincere**,

The scribes & Pharisees looked on their practices as a testimony to true **godliness**.

In reality it was a testimony to their own **self-styled** piety.

When form becomes the focus of attention, it becomes a **barrier** to true righteousness.

It can keep an

- unbeliever from <u>trusting</u> in God &
- a believer from faithfully <u>obeying</u> Him.

The ... fasting ... practiced by the Pharisees was **always** out of place.

- A fast is always meaningless if it is performed from habit & does not result from deep concern & mourning .... over some spiritual need.
- ♣ Going to Church on Sunday is hypocritical if it is done apart from a genuine desire to
  - worship & glorify God.

Fasting springs naturally from a broken & grieving heart, ... but fasting as a shallow spiritual ritual apart from such **brokenness** is an affront to God.

John's disciples had no basis for **genuine** faith since they had not followed Jesus yet

Jesus' made clear that He was teaching an entirely <u>different</u> way of believing, thinking, & living. He did not come to improve the old system but to **renounce** & undermine it.

The two ways cannot be connected to one another or be contained one in the other.

Jesus' new & <u>internal</u> Gospel of forgiveness & cleansing cannot be attached to the old & <u>external</u> traditions of self-righteousness & ritual.

The only life that can contain true righteousness is the <u>new</u> life given by <u>God</u> ..... when a person <u>repents</u> of his sin & <u>trusts</u> in Jesus Christ as Lord & Savior.

Jesus' did not set aside the divine law & usher in **grace** — (Nothing is further from the truth.)

Jesus declared that any opponent of the law was an **opponent** of God (Mt.5.17–19). God's law & His grace have always **coexisted** & have always been perfectly **compatible**.

The **old wineskins** were not the teachings of the O.T. but the rabbinical **traditions**.

## Marks of the true believer:

First, like Matthew, the true believer follows the Lord.

**Second**, the true believer has **compassion** on the unsaved.

Third, a true believer forsakes legalism & ritualism.

- ♣ He fasts only as an expression of genuine <u>spiritual</u> concern.
- ♣ He does not try to attach his new life in Christ to his **old** ritual or religion.
- ♣ He knows that what is begun in the Spirit cannot be completed in the flesh (Ga.3.3).

Freedom in Christ has no part in the bondage of legalism.
