Mt.9.33b-35 "Signposts of Society" Matthew Series: 'THE KING IS COMING' #127 May 16, 2021

Humanity's needed spiritual signposts are very much in place & are entirely reliable.

Among those signposts are

- the miracles that demonstrated Jesus'
 - > divine nature & messiahship,
 - His power to save &
 - His right to <u>rule</u>.

Jesus' miracles were a sign of divine power to some; supernatural marvels by a good man for some; – and to others they were an affront ...

Mary knew that God <u>receives</u> those who come to Him humbly & <u>rejects</u> those who proudly trust in themselves & see no need for His mercy or deliverance.

Those who are blessed are the **<u>saved</u>**, & those who fall under God's woes are the **<u>lost</u>**.

Jesus said

- **4** the **<u>saved</u> are like those who build their lives on the rock of the Lord's righteousness ...**
- ♣ For those who <u>reject</u> Him, He does not "bring peace, but a sword. For I came to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; and a man's enemies will be the members of his household" (vv.34–36).
- **Whether religious or irreligious, only those who turn to God through Jesus Christ <u>can</u> be saved.**
- The more the saved <u>hear</u> & <u>understand</u> & fellowship with those who also believe the Gospel that redeemed them,
- the more they rejoice & grow in their <u>new</u> life in Christ.

I. THE RESPONSES OF THE PEOPLE V.33b

#1 Group of Miracles (8.19–22; cf.Lk.9.57–62): Each was <u>attracted</u> to Jesus but found an <u>excuse</u> for not following Him.

#2 Group of Miracles (9.9-17): Matthew's <u>call & conversion</u>; Pharisee's <u>insincerity</u>; John the Baptist's disciple's <u>confusion</u>.

In every case, there are only two basic decisions-

- > that of true acceptance, which leads to salvation, or
- that of rejection, which leads to <u>damnation</u>.

#3 Group of Miracles: (9.18-33a) The Response of the Crowds & Religionists.

Any response to Jesus but the response of **faith**, amounts to rejection & results in damnation.

II. THE RESPONSE OF THE MULTITUDE

The vast number of miracles made them both *incontestable* & incomprehensible.

The multitude chose to release Barabbas the criminal & to crucify Jesus the Savior.

Many admired Jesus from a distance.

- > They did not lastingly identify with Him or **<u>submit</u>** to Him.
- > They were always astonished & sometimes afraid, but never **<u>committed</u>**.
- > They were mere onlookers, willing to cheer but not willing to **participate**.

Those who once praised became His <u>critics</u>, & those who once marveled became His <u>enemies</u>. ... every other sinner who refuses to <u>repent</u> & <u>receive</u> Him as Savior & Lord is condemned.
